A Busy Year for the Branch

The Branch Annual General Meeting took place in November. The Chairman, Cliff Hayward, described a busy year. It began with an extended programme of indoor talks and workshops were introduced for the first time. The Barrwood and Hilbert Road Apiary meetings provided plenty of opportunity for learning. The Barrwood Apiary land, which was privately owned, has just been bought by Kent Beekeepers Association, which Cliff said would ensure its long-term future as an apiary.

The Membership Secretary and Treasurer, Liz Birchenough, said the number of members had taken a dip during the pandemic but had now returned to pre-Covid levels. She warned against being complacent and said it was important to engage with the local community, for example by manning stalls at fairs, in order to attract new members. In her Treasurer's report Liz said that although the Branch ended the year with the same amount of money in the bank, costs were rising. The charge for hiring the hall is increasing and buildings and contents insurance for the apiaries has risen.
