Clean Comb, Varroa and Swarms

April

Preparing for the Swarming Season

One of the most difficult aspects of beekeeping is preventing your colonies from swarming, especially as most books say that you must first find the queen. At this meeting methods of swarm control that do not require you finding the queen will be explained. *Tuesday 18 April* at 7.30pm at Weald Memorial Hall, Sevenoaks Weald.
