Happy New Year!

If you haven't already started planning for the 2024 beekeeping season then now is the time (*writes Mary Staffurth*). Have your bees got enough stores to see them through to the spring? In our apiary the bees have been flying on warmer days so they are expending energy. Is your equipment clean and ready for use? Have you got enough frames and foundation? If all is in order in the shed or garage then, on these grey, rainy days, you could spend your time making candles from last year's beeswax. Our winter meetings continue this month with a webinar on Asian Hornets. Vanessa Jones will be running a series of Asian Hornet workshops at Hever and there are courses for prospective new beekeepers. See below for details.



Our own hives are at the bottom of the garden, surrounded by trees. We've had an apiary there for close to 30 years but in December, for the first time, something strange happened. The mouseguards on all three hives were pulled off and bent. As they were held on with drawing pins it wouldn't have required much force to remove them. However, the animal concerned had clawed and scratched at the entrance, damaging the wood. Our conclusion is that this was the work of a badger. We have never been aware of badgers in the garden but we live close to Sevenoaks Common and there are highly likely to be setts nearby. We've been blaming the fox for digging up the lawn overnight but now think the badger is the culprit.
